Answer to Scenario 2 - Redress #1

Boats A and B are reinstated in the race to their finishing places under <u>rule 64.2</u>, <u>Decisions on Redress.</u> <u>Rule 63.1</u>, <u>Hearings: Requirement for a Hearing</u>, states, "A boat... shall not be penalized without a hearing..." except in some situations that do not apply in this case. The race committee has the authority, under <u>rule A5</u>, <u>Scores Determined by the Race Committee</u>, to score a boat "Did not finish" without a hearing only when that boat fails to "finish;" i.e., cross the finishing line correctly (see the definition Finish). A and B finish in the defined meaning of the word, and therefore the race committee has no authority to penalize them without a hearing.

In this case, the race committee observes A and B sail the course incorrectly; i.e., apparently break <u>rule 28.1</u>, <u>Sailing the Course</u>. If it wants to act against these boats, it must protest them under <u>rule 60.2(a)</u>, <u>Right to Protest</u>; <u>Right to Request Redress or Rule 69 Action</u>, which will initiate a hearing by the protest committee.

Note: The protest committee cannot protest the boats based on information arising from a request for redress.
